ATTENTION RESIDENTS

President's Message



As of the time I am writing this article we are still waiting for Palm Beach County to approve the permits for our infrastructure jobs. Zarco Construction has told us the bestcase scenario is that the work will begin in early May and the worst-case scenario will be the work beginning in early June. We will keep you updated as to when the work will begin via email blasts.

There have been many rumors about the expansion and opening up of Sims Road from Atlantic Avenue to Linton Blvd. Some

of the rumors say that the bridge over the canal that is needed to get to Atlantic Avenue will be built shortly and Sims Road will then be opened up to all traffic. I heard a rumor that only emergency vehicles headed to Delray Medical Center would be permitted on Sims Road if it is opened up. I have checked with the County and the definitive word is that there are currently no plans to expand and open up Sims Road. Therefore, even if the County decided tomorrow that they want to open up Sims Road from Atlantic Avenue to Linton Blvd it will take years to formulate the plans and then build the bridge over the canal and it will be years before Sims Road could be opened up to through traffic. So, for now, Sims Road will remain as is and traffic will continue to be only to our rear gate.

And finally, a Presidential food review for you. On Friday May 19th we have scheduled a dinner and a movie event. The movie will be Woody Allen's "Bananas" and we will have two food trucks. One truck is a hibachi truck with Asian food and the other is from an incredible bakery located in Boca Raton, called "Just Baked". They have the best brownies I have ever tasted. Some of you have asked me, "Are these those funny brownies"? and the answer is no, they are regular brownies, but they are made with Ghirardelli chocolate and they are outrageously good. Community Affairs

After an absence of three months, its great to be back to report to the community on major community affairs and happenings. It appears that this is the time of the year that things begin slowing down in West Delray.

The Department of Transportation is working with the Lake Worth Drainage District regarding the widening of Atlantic Avenue between the Turnpike and Jog Road. The District has approved the design concept utilizing the District's right of way for the widening. The Department of Transportation is proceeding with project development and environmental studies and will begin public hearings. Studies and preliminary work has been funded; however, construction costs are not funded. The DOT is predicting that construction funds may not be available until fiscal year 2029 unless funds become available earlier.

The Palm Beach County Sheriffs Office reports that although crime is down, traffic accidents have increased. The danger spots are the usual suspects; Jog and Atlantic, Linton and Military, and Lyons and Atlantic.

A new fire station, #49, is under construction at Flavor Pict and Lyons.

The Solid Waste Authority reminds everyone that certain materials such as paint and lithium batteries should be brought to the SWA center for proper disposal.

Various proposals for the redevelopment of the Delray Beach Golf Course as well as funding for these proposals are being considered and public meetings have been held to discuss.

Security

WALKERS, JOGGERS & BIKE RIDERS ETIQUETTE:

With daylight savings time here, more walkers, joggers and bike riders are taking advantage of the extended daylight hours. Walking, jogging and bike riding are great activities and exercises to do right now. It is important for everyone to be aware of some simple guidelines for sharing LOD walkways.

FRIENDLY REMINDERS FOR BIKE RIDERS:

- Respect the rules of the road. If riding in the street, ride with traffic, not against it. Not only is bike riding against traffic illegal in most states, but it is also dangerous. Use hand signals to warn other road users that you will be making a turn or will be stopping.
- Be aware of drivers making turns in and out of parking lots.
- When riding on the sidewalk, give walkers and joggers space. Slow down and announce your presence by ringing a bike bell or horn, or just announce that you are coming up behind them when planning to pass.
- Wear a helmet and other safety equipment. Wear light colored or reflective clothing as it gets dark.
- Remain unplugged from phones, music or other noise distractions so you can hear background noise or potential hazards.
- Ride predictably, not haphazardly.
- When passing a walker/jogger look ahead and behind to ensure it is safe to pass.
- If riding at night, use lights: a red light for the back, and a white one for the front.
- Don't be an apathetic rider...SAY HELLO.

FRIENDLY REMINDERS FOR WALKERS AND JOGGERS:

- A lot of the bike riding guidelines hold true for walkers and joggers.
- Give everyone space.
- Be aware of your surroundings. Look ahead for bike riders, joggers and fast walkers. As soon as possible, move over to give them room to pass.
- When crossing a road and a driver about to turn is allowing you the right of way, thank him/her by making eye contact or giving a polite smile or hand wave. Try not to stop suddenly.
- Do not take up the entire walkway. When walking in a group, be courteous and cautious by being aware of other walkers or riders that may need to pass from either direction.
- Stick to one side of the walkway. When possible, avoid walking in the middle or changing sides on the walkway. This allows those who are moving faster than you to pass, If you are planning on passing another walker, announce yourself by saying out loud "On your left". Let other people pass you as well.
- Remain unplugged from phones, music or other distractions so you can hear background noise and potential hazards. It is okay to answer an occasional text or phone call or change a song, but do not go updating your Facebook status or uploading a picture on Instagram while walking. Not only is it dangerous, but it is inconsiderate when you are walking slower than the people behind you.
- Don't multitask. WALKERS, JOGGERS AND BIKE RIDERS SHARE THE CIRCLE.

Rules and Regulations By: Harry Brudka

Family or friends visiting the local area or staying with a resident that are 16 or older and wish to use the CLUBHOUSE or RECREATIONAL AREAS should be issued a guest pass at the office or from the Clubhouse guard.

- Any resident requesting a guest pass must accompany the guest to the office and show proof of residency (LOD picture ID).
- Passes are NOT issued in advance and are for use for a specific date or group of dates. Passes cannot exceed 14 days.
- Guest passes permit guests to use the clubhouse or attend any LOD sponsored event or class. Without a pass, guests will be asked to pay the required facilities fee.
- If the office is closed, a guest pass may be obtained from the clubhouse guard. Any resident requesting a guest pass must accompany the guest to the Clubhouse guard and show proof of residency (LOD picture ID).

RESIDENTS SHALL BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ACTIONS OF THEIR GUESTS. ANY GUEST ABUSING THEIR PRIVILEGES, OR NOT ADHERING TO LOD RULES & REGULATIONS, WILL BE DENIED USE OF THE FACILITIES.



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

Dog Decorum: Etiquette Tips for Dog Owners

Always Pick Up After Your Dog:

Picking up waste from your dog is by far the #1 dog etiquette rule, because dogs' waste can spread disease, is harmful to the environment, and not picking it up is just plain gross. Don't aggravate other dog owners or neighbors walking outside – pick it up and toss it away in your HOA dumpster. If your dog has an accident in the catwalk, elevator or common walking path, it is your job to clean it up.

Control Their Barking:

There is no bigger pet peeve for your neighbors than a dog that barks uncontrollably. Usually this occurs when someone knocks on the door, or they hear someone in the hallway that startles them. But barking can also happen when you're away, because they're sad, bored, or just miss you. If you have received noise complaints from neighbors, take it seriously and figure out what is causing your dog to bark.

Keep Them on a Short Leash in the Community and in Your Condo Building:

I love my dog, you love your dog; but not everyone in the LOD is a dog lover. Residents may be afraid, allergic or just don't like dogs. Keeping your dog on a leash (preferably a short one) is the courteous thing to do, but it is also the law in Palm Beach County. It's also important when coming into entryways, catwalks, common areas, and elevators that your leash is short (i.e. 3- 4 feet) and that you don't let your dog charge into spaces or jump on residents. Not every dog wants to meet your dog. When you are in a situation where you cannot avoid other dogs, ensure your leash is kept short. That way no interactions between dogs can happen. If a dog happens to show that he wants space, the best thing to do is keep moving past the dog. Stopping and allowing your dog to fixate will only make the situation worse. If you know other dog owners who have dogs that are friendly and they like to meet: that is great!

Play by the "Common Area" Rules:

LOD has common areas which are shared spaces where both residents and dogs interact. It's not a personal playground, so play by the rules of the condo and be a good neighbor. When walking around the community counterclockwise, your dog should be on your right side along the grass (common area). The grass area and tall hedges on your left (in front of the condo parking lots) are private property. It's dangerous to walk your dog along the tall hedges because aside to being exposed to pesticides, they may end up in a fight with a wild goose, squirrel, or raccoon.

Avoid Wandering:

Always keep an eye on your dog to make sure they don't wander or run onto private property. As you walk them, keep them close to you, especially when you are talking on your cell phone.

Friendly Reminder - The Lakes of Delray is a NO Pet Community:

All Service and ESA dogs must be registered with the LOD Property Management Office prior to entry into the premises. Dog owners must provide to the Property Manager the following documents (required by Florida State law): <u>Florida Mental Health Care provider prescription/letter for the ESA dog or certification/letter qualifying the service dog, Palm Beach County dog license along with current rabies vaccination paperwork.</u> Dogs without these qualifying documents may be treated as a pet for purposes of LOD policies.

When walking your support animal please carry the pets ID with you. Thank you.

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
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LAKES OF DELRAY, INC. BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S MEETING

MINUTES

The Lakes of Delray, Inc. held its Board of Director's Meeting at 15055 Lakes of Delray Boulevard, Delray Beach, Florida 33484, on Wednesday, March 8, 2023. Present were: President Bob Berger, 2nd Vice President Dave Passman, Secretary Jayne Kulyassa, Director Susan Heiferman, Director Jessica Krulfeifer, Director Harry Brudka, and Community Manager Ron Nolan

Not Present: 1st Vice President Ed Simon, Treasurer Lonnie Aronson, and Director Robin Warner.

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 am by Bob Berger, who then led the attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance. Secretary Jayne Kulyassa declared that a quorum exists.

Verification of the Associations not present: Ashland G, Pembridge B, Pembridge H, Watersedge D, and Witney B.

President Bob Berger moved to approve the minutes of the March 8, 2023 meeting; Jayne Kulyassa seconds.

CORRESPONDENCE: Jayne Kulyassa

No Report

PRESIDENT Bob Berger:

- 1. At this time, we are still waiting for Palm Beach County to approve the permits for our infrastructure jobs. Zarco Construction has told us the best-case scenario is that the work will begin in early May and the worst-case scenario will be the work beginning in early June. We will keep you updated as to when the work will begin via email blasts.
- 2. During new business, the Board will be voting on purchasing a used golf cart which is needed by our maintenance staff.
- 3. There have been many rumors about the expansion and opening up of Sims Road from Atlantic Avenue to Linton Blvd. Some of the rumors say that the bridge over the canal that is needed to get to Atlantic Avenue will be built shortly and Sims Road will then be opened up to all traffic. I heard a rumor that only emergency vehicles headed to Delray Medical Center would be permitted on Sims Road if it is opened up. I have checked with the County and the definitive word is that there are currently no plans to expand and open up Sims Road. Therefore, even if the County decided tomorrow that they want to open up Sims Road from Atlantic Avenue to Linton Blvd it will take years to formulate the plans and then build the bridge over the canal and it will be years before Sims Road could be opened up to through traffic. So, for now, Sims Road will remain as is and traffic will continue to be only to our rear gate for our residents. Dave will discuss that there is no

money for the Sims Road and other road expansion projects in his report.

- 4. We had to close our main pool for a day because a child had an accident and made doody in the pool. We took the caution of shocking the pool for the entire day which is why the pool remained closed for the balance of that day. Jessica will talk about proper pool attire for children in her report.
- 5. Our Friday afternoon and night movies no longer draw many residents. You may have noticed that on the last Friday of March, we had the 1963 movie "It's A Mad Mad Mad World" and on the last Friday of April we will be showing National Lampoon's "Animal House" which was released in 1978. We are trying to attract some more people to the free movies and we will continue to show popular movies from when we were all young once a month if they do indeed draw more people.

On Friday, May 19th we have scheduled dinner and a movie. We will have two food trucks. One truck is a hibachi truck with Asian food and the other is from an incredible bakery located in Boca Raton, called "Just Baked". They have the best brownies I have ever tasted. Some of you have asked me, "Are these those funny brownies"? And the answer is no, they are regular brownies, but they are made with Ghirardelli chocolate and they are outrageously good. You do not need to be a doctor of delectable or a brownieologist to enjoy them. But if you like brownies, please come and give them a try.

- 6. Last Friday we held our annual Volunteer Breakfast at the Delray Beach Country Club. I am pleased to announce that our Volunteer of the Year is Susan Heiferman and our Lifetime Achievement Award went to Rita Noce. Congratulations to both of them.
- 7. Last week we had 63 residents test for Covid and seven people tested positive. Yesterday only 40 residents got tested due to the weather. We have tested a total of 5,528 residents and staff since our weekly testing started in January 2022. Unfortunately, the weekly Covid testing will be ending on Tuesday, May 9th, because the federal government has declared the pandemic is over on May 10th and testing will no longer be free. However, Anthony Terzo is working on a program where he may be able to get Dr. Marouth involved in testing Medicare patients who have been exposed to Covid. Dr. Marouth is the doctor who had been administering the antibody testing. I will not get details on this for a while and hopefully, I should have more information in time for the May meeting.
- 8. Paul Saperstein, who is one of several real estate agents who takes out a full-page advertisement in the LOD Times, has made up and donated some LOD baseball caps. To celebrate the start of the baseball season I am going to ask Anthony to play a video of when a major TV star tried out for the Los Angeles Dodgers back in the 1960's and at the end of the video, I will have a pop quiz and those who answer the questions correctly first will win one of these new LOD baseball hats. 

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


