Calling the guest authorization system requires that the phone number your are calling from is registered in our database in order to avoid the requirement to enter your phone number and security code when using that system. 



- To purchase a portable pool lift to provide disabled residents easier entrance from the main pool
- To put forward a bylaw referendum vote to ban open carry projectile weapons from LOD common property
- To put forward a bylaw referendum to increase the community contribution fee for new unit purchases from a one-time fee of \$2000 to \$2500
- To put forward a bylaw referendum to terminate our ceramics room at the end of the season and reutilize this valuable space in a fashion to be determined during the Clubhouse renovation.

The last three items will be put forward to an all-association vote shortly as a 75% or more majority is required to reform our bylaws. You will be notified with sufficient time to make your vote count.

We talked about strict observance of the stop signs on our property. There are terrible accidents occurring all the time in West Delray. We want to keep our friends and loved ones within our gates as safe as we can, at all times.

The renovation committee had a big meeting with the designer on December 19. We hope to release some designs to the community shortly after, so you can see what the future will look like. The committee has spent a lot of time planning for a “timeless” design, and we hope that everyone will appreciate the new look we will all get to enjoy. And yes, we are still planning on having an elevator from the first floor to the second floor to give everyone more access to our Clubhouse.

We have other improvements planned through 2026 as well as some great entertainment coming up.

I have promised to keep the agenda meetings and board meetings as short as possible and will keep my lengthy pontifications to the LOD Times.

Nothing to pontificate this month so just one last thing.

Comcast

Below is the latest update from the Comcast Construction Division:

Construction Meeting – December 11th

Construction will meet onsite and provide physical samples of the ONUs, molding options, and related materials.

Design Plans for Two- and Three-Story Buildings

Construction will present the complete design layouts specific to both two- and three-story buildings, ensuring the association has full visibility and clarity on the installation approach.

Dedicated Project Manager

A project manager will be formally assigned to oversee the EPON project. Jessica will serve as the primary contact, ensuring consistent communication and streamlined coordination.

Dual Network Availability During Transition

Comcast will maintain both the legacy network and the fiber-to-the-unit (FTTU) EPON network until the transition is fully completed, ensuring uninterrupted service for residents.

Legacy Network Decommission Timeline

Comcast will notify Lakes of Delray in advance when the legacy network is scheduled for disconnection. This will allow the association to communicate with any residents who need to schedule their appointments to transition to the new FTTU service.

Certification and Unit Extensions- January 2026

Comcast will certify the fiber-to-the-unit infrastructure in January 2026. At this stage, the team will begin extending service into individual units. Each unit can be activated with the new installation without the entire building being activated.

Resident Impact and Improved Services

- Symmetrical high-speed internet
- Significant reduction in trouble calls and service disruptions

Ongoing Communication with the Association

Comcast will provide updates weekly or biweekly so the board can keep residents informed and maintain transparency throughout the project.

If you are still having issues after going through the process of having Comcast, send a technician to fix the problem(s). Please let me know and we will escalate your complaint to a dedicated bulk services team.

The Bulk Services Troubleshooting dedicated phone number for us is 800 934 6489. If you would rather text them and not wait in the phone system, the contact is: (On It) and they will return your call.

Helpful SCAM Reminders to be Aware of -

- Remember to be aware of suspicious activity whether in-person, virtually, or over the phone.
- STOP and analyze your encounters.
- **Do not hesitate to call the police if you sense suspicious activity.**

Rules and Regulations with Patio Furniture

The movement of the patio furniture has become a major problem that is damaging the furniture itself and wasting an extraordinary amount of the staff time having to move furniture back to its original spot and resetting the entire pool deck daily. Dragging lounge chairs all over the pool deck is noisy and wearing on the leg glides like the tires on your car.

One of the biggest problems is that many residents have limited consideration for their fellow neighbors and consistently clutter traffic areas so others, especially those needing wheelchairs, walkers or canes, can't walk through. This is not only inconsiderate but a fire hazard. Traffic areas must be kept clear at all times. Please make sure there is a wide enough aisle between chairs and tables to maneuver a wheelchair and/or walker.

No one should be dragging a lounge from one side of the pool to the other. If you need to rotate a lounge to face the sun or your friends, go ahead but dragging them all over the deck, and completely rearranging the deck as if it's your personal patio is unacceptable. Lounge chairs are bulky and hard to move so ask a buddy to help.

REMEMBER...The LOD Pool Cabana Boy no longer works here.

-Each table has 4 chairs assigned to it. For those neighbors playing games, chairs are for sitting upon, not handbags or totes... especially on a busy pool day.

-No furniture can be placed within 4 feet of the pool edge. Close the umbrella after each use.

-When 'borrowing' an empty chair from an occupied table, if possible, ask if you can use that chair. Just because nothing is on the chair at an occupied table does not mean it is not being used. It's understandable that furniture movement happens when you sit together or play with a group of friends or neighbors, but please remember to move the item back to its original location...

Dog Decorum: Tips for Dog Owners

Always Pick Up After Your Dog:

Picking up waste from your dog is by far the #1 dog etiquette rule, because dogs' waste can spread disease, is harmful to the environment, and not picking it up is just plain gross. Don't aggravate other dog owners or neighbors walking outside – pick it up and toss it away in your HOA dumpster. If your dog has an accident on the catwalk, elevator or common walking path, it is your job to clean it up.

Control Their Barking:

There is no bigger pet peeve for your neighbors than a dog that barks uncontrollably. Usually this occurs when someone knocks on the door, or they hear someone in the hallway that startles them. But barking can also happen when you're away, because they're sad, bored, or just miss you. If you have received noise complaints from neighbors, take it seriously and figure out what is causing your dog to bark.

Keep Them on a Short Leash in the Community and in Your Condo Building:

I love my dog, you love your dog; but not everyone in the LOD is a dog lover. Residents may be afraid, allergic or just don't like dogs. Keeping your dog on a leash (preferably a short one) is the courteous thing to do, but it is also the law in Palm Beach County. It's also important when coming into entryways, catwalks, common areas, and elevators that your leash is short (i.e. 3- 4 feet) and that you don't let your dog charge into spaces or jump on residents. **No retractable leases only 5 foot maximum.** Not every dog wants to meet your dog. When you are in a situation where you cannot avoid other dogs, ensure your leash is kept short. That way no interactions between dogs can happen. If a dog happens to show that he wants space, the best thing to do is keep moving past the dog. Stopping and allowing your dog to fixate will only make the situation worse. If you know other dog owners who have dogs that are friendly and they like to meet: that is great!

Play by the "Common Area" Rules:

LOD has common areas which are shared spaces where both residents and dogs interact. It's not a personal playground, so play by the rules of the condo and be a good neighbor. When walking around the community counterclockwise, your dog should be on your right side along the grass (common area). The grass area and tall hedges on your left (in front of the condo parking lots) are private property. It's dangerous to walk your dog along the tall hedges because aside to being exposed to pesticides, they may end up in a fight with a wild goose, squirrel, or raccoon. **NO ESA dogs on the pool deck.**

Avoid Wandering:

Always keep an eye on your dog to make sure they don't wander or run onto private property. As you walk them, keep them close to you, especially when you are talking on your cell phone.

Just a Friendly Reminder - The Lakes of Delray is a NO Pet Community: All Service and ESA dogs must be registered with the LOD Property Management Office prior to entry into the premises. Dog owners must provide to the Property Manager the following documents (required by Florida State law): Florida Mental Health Care provider prescription/letter for the ESA dog or certification/letter qualifying the service dog, Palm Beach County dog license along with current rabies vaccination paperwork. Dogs without these qualifying documents may be treated as a pet for purposes of LOD policies.







The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Dave Passman. Dave Passman then led the attendees to the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Dave Passman asked that a quorum exist. Secretary Jessica Krulfeifer said yes, quorum existed.

President Dave Passman requests a motion to approve the meeting minutes for November 12, 2025. Lonnie Aronson motions to approve, and Harry Brudka seconds the motion. The motion passed 8-0.

No Report

PRESIDENT: Dave Passman

I just wanted to mention that our dear friend and colleague Anthony Napoli was in a small car accident yesterday. He will be alright. Keep him in your thoughts. Some of you may be aware that Ed Simon has retired from the Board of Directors at the agenda meeting. We would like to thank and commend Ed for his contributions and his years of dedicated service to the Board of Directors. Thank you for all the efforts that you have made on behalf of the community.

I would like to turn this over to our Director, Mike Palais, who is our health and safety officer, and would like to share some information with you today. Everyone in Florida knows that there are traffic lights that people do not stop at, and now we have a problem with stop signs in the community. There are stop signs and lines beyond the stop sign and the sidewalk, and the street. Sometimes we have people who do not want to stop. A pedestrian will be walking by, and soon, there will be an accident, and someone will get hit. Please just take a moment and observe the stop sign. We shouldn't have any problems.

We are seriously looking into installing fountains in our lakes. Ron will mention this in his report. We will start the renovation and then investigate the fountains. There are pros and cons to letting everyone know that we are looking into it.

An interesting thing came up the other day. John Bostrom is a resident and author. He is very interested in writing a small

book or pamphlet about the history of the Lakes of Delray. Going back to the beginning. He would like to incorporate thoughts from our older citizens. Landscaping, we are discussing the Ficus hedge and the possibility of replacing it with a Clusia hedge. We are also looking into having the landscaper come more often to trim the Ficus hedge since it becomes overgrown quickly.

We have received feedback from residents on the flowers on the pool deck and the bees. We are trying to find the correct flowers and foliage for the pool area. We will be switching these plants out every few months to see what works best. We are looking at the flowers at the entrance and at the Clubhouse. We continue to have iguana issues.

I had a suggestion for those who do laps in the pool: if they could do their laps not lengthwise but from side to side. Many residents swim in the shallow end, and it is disruptive for both parties, just something to consider.

LIBRARY REPORT: Jessica Krulfeifer

We are looking for donations for magazines; we will welcome any current magazines.

COMCAST: John Callanan

Comcast will be meeting with us tomorrow to discuss the construction plan for the fiber optics installation. They will be showing us physical samples of the equipment that will be installed in each unit. They will show us the plans for the two-story and three-story buildings, as well as how they will be connected. They have assigned a dedicated project manager to our community. This manager will provide consistent communication, streamlining the coordination with updates every two weeks. During the transition, we will have dual networks available. If you see Comcast in the community, you may notice that we have six or seven main boxes that bring the signal into the community. This is then split up to go to each of the buildings. They will be installing new main boxes for the dual signal. This way, there will not be any interruption. The legacy system that we have now will always be live while they are installing the new network.

Starting in January, they will be updating each unit. You will be given a phone number to schedule an appointment for installation in your unit. The process will take about one to one and a half hours. They will bring all the equipment that needs to be swapped out. They will make sure that you are alive and your system is working well with fiber optics. They expect a rapid turnaround. Once they have certified your fiber optics, they will disconnect you from the legacy system. Each unit can be hooked up one at a time; the entire building does not have to be connected to go live. For those of us who are snowbirds, you will have the convenience of hooking up to the fiber optic when we are here at the Lakes of Delray.

PROPERTY MANAGER'S REPORT: Ron Nolan

- The special assessment invoices have been sent to all the associations and management companies with a due date of March 25, 2025. That is the due date each association is required to pay LOD. You should be receiving a bill from your associations very shortly, designating the due dates for your final payment, which is \$1,500 per door.
- We are looking into a new electronic sign, like the one we have in the lobby. We will place it where the bulletin boards were, which did not get much attention. Hopefully, this will be bright enough and get a lot more attention.
- Harry Brudka and I will finish working on the rules and regulations. We hope to finish up by the end of the month. Then we will present that to the board with all the updates.
- We have contacted a consultant to give us recommendations for making crosswalks, since we have none in this community. Considering the concern, we have a lot of pedestrians. We are looking into crosswalks and two additional stop signs.
- As Dave Passman mentioned, we are looking into fountains for the lakes. We had a vendor out here working on numbers and ideas as well.
- The Sims Road gate trap project, Dave and I went back there to review the issues that we have. We must be careful in implementing this because there are complications. We do not want this to be problematic for our residents, as it is a solution. I have two bids for doing that project already.
- I will be looking into another version of the office database and security system. This is a cloud-based system. This will allow us to add other features when we need to. I will be meeting with our vendor tomorrow.
- We have ordered new signs, and new signs are being considered for the Sims Road entrance.
- We are waiting for a light pole to be repaired, here by the stairs to the Clubhouse.
- Pickleball court repairs are underway, and a pressure wash will be scheduled.
- I'm still waiting for a bid for the sidewalk repair by the BBQ area, which is a 25-foot section.
- I just received a bid for paving to finish the entrance road to the community.
- The Community portal is required for documents and financials and is underway. I have compiled a list to begin the database. The first list will be 850 residents who will receive an invitation to create user username and passwords. Those who are not on the list will also be sent an invitation to sign up through our email blast. This invitation is only being sent to owners. Many occupants and renters will not receive the invitation.
- For those who are wondering about the cones on the LOD Blvd road, the whole situation is worse, and with investigation and the county, this is a sewer line that is collapsing. It's not just the roadway, but a light pole that is right there has sunk into the ground two and one-half feet. The surprising thing is that the pole is functioning. Palm Beach County will be repairing the sewer line.

New Business:

John Callanan, I make a motion to proceed with the proposed purchase of a mobile pool lift for handicapped use of the main pool. The modeling cost will be with a future vote, not to

exceed \$15,000 in cost, and to include the requirement for a hold harmless waiver to be signed by each user.

The motion was seconded by Harry Brudka, and the vote passed 8-0

Jayne Weiss, I make a motion to remove the Ceramic room as an amenity. The change will be approved by our attorney and voted on by the members of the association at a later date.

The motion was seconded by Robin Warner, and the vote passed 8-0

Mike Palais, I make a motion to add an amendment to the bylaws of Lakes of Delray to prohibit the open carry of guns on the common property. The exact language is to be approved by our attorney and voted on by members of the association at a later date.

Lonna Aronson seconds, the vote passed 8-0

Robin Warner, I make a motion to increase the capital contributions fee to \$2,500. The amendment will be approved by our attorney and voted on by members of the association at a later date.

Dave Passman seconds, and the vote passes 8-0.

Sue Ash, I, Comcast questions on the two-story buildings. I have a concern about where the installation will be in the laundry room.
