



Dog Decorum: Etiquette Tips for Dog Owners

Always Pick Up After Your Dog:

Picking up waste from your dog is by far the #1 dog etiquette rule, because dogs' waste can spread disease, is harmful to the environment, and not picking it up is just plain gross. Don't aggravate other dog owners or neighbors walking outside – pick it up and toss it away in your HOA dumpster. If your dog has an accident in the catwalk, elevator or common walking path, it is your job to clean it up.

Control Their Barking:

There is no bigger pet peeve for your neighbors than a dog that barks uncontrollably. Usually this occurs when someone knocks on the door, or they hear someone in the hallway that startles them. But barking can also happen when you're away, because they're sad, bored, or just miss you. If you have received noise complaints from neighbors, take it seriously and figure out what is causing your dog to bark.

Keep Them on a Short Leash in the Community and in Your Condo Building:

I love my dog, you love your dog; but not everyone in the LOD is a dog lover. Residents may be afraid, allergic or just don't like dogs. Keeping your dog on a leash (preferably a short one) is the courteous thing to do, but it is also the law in Palm Beach County. It's also important when coming into entryways, catwalks, common areas, and elevators that your leash is short (i.e. 3- 4 feet) and that you don't let your dog charge into spaces or jump on residents. Not every dog wants to meet your dog. When you are in a situation where you cannot avoid other dogs, ensure your leash is kept short. That way no interactions between dogs can happen. If a dog happens to show that he wants space, the best thing to do is keep moving past the dog. Stopping and allowing your dog to fixate will only make the situation worse. If you know other dog owners who have dogs that are friendly and they like to meet: that is great!

Play by the "Common Area" Rules:

LOD has common areas which are shared spaces where both residents and dogs interact. It's not a personal play-ground, so play by the rules of the condo and be a good neighbor. When walking around the community counter-clockwise, your dog should be on your right side along the grass (common area). The grass area and tall hedges on your left (in front of the condo parking lots) are private property. It's dangerous to walk your dog along the tall hedges because aside to being exposed to pesticides, they may end up in a fight with a wild goose, squirrel, or raccoon.

Avoid Wandering:

Always keep an eye on your dog to make sure they don't wander or run onto private property. As you walk them, keep them close to you, especially when you are talking on your cell phone.

Friendly Reminder - The Lakes of Delray is a NO Pet Community:

All Service and ESA dogs must be registered with the LOD Property Management Office prior to entry into the premises. Dog owners must provide to the Property Manager the following documents (required by Florida State law): Florida Mental Health Care provider prescription/letter for the ESA dog or certification/letter qualifying the service dog, Palm Beach County dog license along with current rabies vaccination paperwork. Dogs without these qualifying documents may be treated as a pet for purposes of LOD policies.

President's Message

On behalf of the Board of Directors I want to thank all of you who voted for us at the November meeting. We all sincerely appreciate your support. Over the past two years the Board has implemented many improvements to the Lakes of Delray including the total covering of the barbecue area, repaving of the walking paths, the hiring of Hillman Engineering and then Zarco Stucco Construction Company to prepare and ultimately perform the infrastructure jobs, capital contributions, creating more activities on non-show days, email blasts, an updated LOD website, better communication with our residents via email blasts and a Board email address, a revamped Café LOD, weekly Covid testing, vaccinations and there is more to come including the planning stage of the Clubhouse renovations.

I want to welcome Robin Warner to the Board, and I want to say a fond farewell to Rita Noce who has served this community well for so many years. Rita is a passionate and caring person who has done a great job serving our community. We all wish her well.

At the November meeting, I announced that the cost of the Hillman Engineering infrastructure jobs came to \$974,500.00 and there will be a \$625. assessment to pay for the decking repair and spa replacement part of the Hillman Engineering infrastructure jobs. This dollar figure of the assessment is based on the thirty-seven associations voting to permit the Board to borrow up to \$150,000. from the reserves to pay for the lighting part of these projects and to provide money for any cost overruns which will be repaid with the next round of capital contributions. I assured everyone at the November meeting that borrowing up to \$150,000.00 from the reserves in no way jeopardizes us or our reserves. Even if we had a catastrophic hurricane before the money is repaid, we would have more than enough money to pay for any insurance deductibles. That vote took place on November 22nd, and I will provide the results of that vote in the January edition of the LOD Times. (The deadline for me to submit this article was November 11th which is two weeks before the vote) The Board has made it clear that we do not want to have an assessment for the lighting part of the Hillman Engineering projects.

Once again, some residents are experiencing pixelization and freezing of their TV pictures. I have been in contact with our Comcast representative, and he has informed me that the best way they can correct this situation is to have anyone who is experiencing this problem to document the problem by providing the channel number they are having the problem with as well as the date and time of the problem. With this documentation you also need to provide Comcast your name, your address with apartment number and phone number associated with your account. If you are having the pixelization or freezing of the screen problem, please take the time to document the problem. You can either write the information on a piece of paper and turn it into the office or you can email me at the Board's email address which is board.lod@gmail.com Both the office and I, will forward all documentation to Comcast.

I want to wish all those celebrating Hanukah, Christmas, or Kwanzaa a great holiday season and a happy and healthy New Year. I hope to see everyone at our annual New Year's Eve party where we will not only be celebrating New Years, but also the 40th anniversary of the Lakes of Delray.

Presently, the new bar-coded ID is necessary to gain admittance to the clubhouse as well as using the Sims Road walking entrance/ exit







Wednesday, November 9, 2022

MINUTES

The Lakes of Delray, Inc. held its Board of Director's Meeting at 15055 Lakes of Delray Boulevard, Delray Beach, Florida 33484, on Wednesday, November 9, 2022. Present were: President Bob Berger, 1st Vice President Ed Simon, 2nd Vice President Dave Passman, Treasurer Lonnie Aronson, Secretary Jayne Kulyassa, Director Rita Noce, Director Susan Heiferman, Director Jessica Krulfeifer, Director Harry Brudka, and Community Manager Ron Nolan

All Present.

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 am by Bob Berger, who then led the attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance. Secretary Jayne Kulyassa declared that a quorum exists.

Verification of the Associations not present: Pembridge E and Watersedge B.

President Bob Berger moved to approve the minutes of the October 12, 2022 meeting; Harry Brudka seconds.

CORRESPONDENCE: Jayne Kulyassa

No Report

PRESIDENT Bob Berger:

- I am extremely disappointed that only 45 residents showed up for the meet the candidates meeting last month. Seven Associations did not show at all. How are they supposed to vote for the Board of Directors. That is not fair to anyone who is running for the Board or to any owner in this community.
- 2) There is going to be an assessment for the decking and the spa part of the Hillman Job. I will review with you the cost of these jobs. The decking came in at \$196.792, the spa will cost \$568,417, the lighting \$82,181, and the total cost is \$847,391. Hillman Engineering will receive a 15% fee, for a total cost of \$974,500.
- 3) Hillman bids...read the cost of the three jobs and announce the assessment of \$625 per unit...voting on hiring Zarco Stucco Construction during new business. (Explain the borrowing of up to \$150,000.00 from the reserves for the lighting and as a contingency for cost overruns so we will not have to have a further assessment (if we have cost overruns.)
- 4) At the September meeting, I mentioned that the Board realizes that we are all in a tough time and we want to be compassionate, and we do not want to assess the lighting

part of these projects. Ron explained the need for the lighting part of the projects. There needs to be a vote of the 37 associations to permit the Board to borrow the money from the reserves...meeting to vote on borrowing the money will be on Tuesday, November 22nd at 11 AM. The proxies can be turned into the office up until the time of the meeting. As I also said at the September meeting there is some legalese at the bottom of the proxy which says that if the Board needs the money borrowed back immediately, we can assess the owners for it.

WAIVING OF RESERVES, IN WHOLE OR IN PART, OR ALLOWING ALTERNATIVE USES OF EXISTING RESERVES MAY RESULT IN UNIT OWNER LIABILITY FOR PAYMENT OF UNANTICIPATED SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS REGARDING THOSE ITEMS.

What it is saying is that we would have to assess you. We have no intention of doing that, we have plenty of money in the reserves for a catastrophic event. That legalese has to be there on that proxy; please do not let it scare you.

- 5) Please let me be very clear. The Board has no intention of assessing to get that money back. Even if we had a catastrophic hurricane like hurricane Ian, we would have more than enough money in the reserves to pay any insurance deductibles without assessing anyone. The repayment of the borrowed money will come from the second round of capital contributions.
- 6) Assessment payments. The Board has decided to permit the associations to pay the assessment in two payments which will be due two months apart. We will give the associations two months from the date of the vote to make the first payment and two additional months to make the 2nd payment.
- 7) I have spoken to the management companies, and I have recommended to them, and I recommended to the association Presidents at last week's President's Forum to open a new account that should be used only for the assessment money, and then that account should be closed after the assessment. Additionally, I recommend that the management companies make up an Excel spreadsheet for each building listing all the owners and the dates they have made their payments. The Board is giving the associations the option of making two payments and the associations can give their owners any payment terms that they see fit. Harvey Levine of Vesta is working on this, and the owner of Oxford Management called and told me that they would not do this unless the individual association requested that they do this for them, and I did not hear back from Phoenix Management. I think the advice as to how to keep track of the assessment is sound but ultimately how you do this is up to you.
- 8) Bus contract....I gave you misinformation at the September meeting. Stan has given me the

contract...we will vote during new business. The new two year contract will be at the same price as the last contract, and they will be coming here to take everyone's photo and they will be issuing ID cards for the bus. You will need their Palm Tran ID to use the bus. Your LOD ID will no longer get you onto the bus and we are negotiating what can be done if anything to prevent outsiders from getting off the bus in the Lakes of Delray.

- 9) No ID cards for ticketed events since we are no longer checking outsiders' vaccination cards.
- 10) Clubhouse room rentals will be available soon, cost \$200 and \$150 + \$50 cleaning refundable deposit
- 11) Comcast. Over the past few weeks, many of you have once again experienced pixelization and freezing of your TV screens after having the fiberoptics hooked up. I have spoken to our Comcast representative, and I must ask you to do the following if you are having a pixelization or picture-freezing problem. I need you to please document the problem by writing down the channel the problem occurred on as well as the date and time and either drop that information off at the office or email us at board.lod@gmail.com. Comcast has informed us that the only way they can figure out the problem is to get the cases of pixelization and picture freezing documented. I urge you to please take the time to document the problems and get them to us and we will forward them to Comcast. The more documentation we can give them the better.
- 12) Covid tested 47 residents last week with three positives. A total of 3,947 residents and staff tested since last January.
