Calling the guest authorization system requires that the phone number your are calling from is registered in our database in order to avoid the requirement to enter your phone number and security code when using that system. WALKERS, JOGGERS & BIKE RIDERS ETIQUETTE

With daylight savings time here, more walkers, joggers and bike riders are taking advantage of the extended daylight hours. Walking, jogging and bike riding are great activities and exercises to do right now. It is important for everyone to be aware of some simple guidelines for sharing LOD walkways.

FRIENDLY REMINDERS FOR BIKE RIDERS

- Respect the rules of the road. If riding in the street, ride with traffic, not against it. Not only is bike riding against traffic illegal in most states, but it is also dangerous. Use hand signals to warn other road users that you will be making a turn or will be stopping.
- Be aware of drivers making turns, in and out of parking lots.
- Give walkers and joggers space. Announce your presence by ringing a bike bell or horn, or just announce that you are coming up behind them, planning to turn or stopping.
- Wear a helmet and other safety equipment. Wear light colored or reflective clothing as it gets dark.
- Remain unplugged from phones, music or other noise distractions so you can hear background noise or potential hazards.
- Ride predictably, not haphazardly.
- When passing a walker/jogger look ahead and behind to ensure it is safe to pass.
- If riding at night, use lights, a red light for the back, and a white one for the front.
- Don't be an apathetic rider...SAY HELLO.

FRIENDLY REMINDERS FOR WALKERS AND JOGGERS

- A lot of the bike riding guidelines hold true for walkers and joggers.
- Give everyone space.
- Be aware of your surroundings. Look ahead for bike riders, joggers and fast walkers. When possible, move over to give them room to pass.
- When crossing a road and a car driver about to turn is allowing you the right of way, thank him/her by
 making eye contact or giving a polite smile or hand wave. Try not to stop suddenly.
- Do not take up the entire walkway. If walking in a group, try not to walk in a parallel line.
- Stick to one side of the walkway. When possible, avoid walking in the middle or changing sides on the walkway. This allows those who are moving faster than you to pass, If you are planning on passing another walker, announce yourself by saying out loud "on your left". Let other people pass you as well.
- Remain unplugged from phones, music or other distractions so you can hear background noise and
 potential hazards. It is okay to answer an occasional text or phone call or change a song, but do not
 go updating your Facebook status or uploading a picture on Instagram while walking. Not only is it
 dangerous, but it is inconsiderate when you walking slower than the people behind you.
- Don't multitask.

Dog Decorum: Tips for Dog Owners

Always Pick Up After Your Dog:

Picking up waste from your dog is by far the #1 dog etiquette rule, because dogs' waste can spread disease, is harmful to the environment, and not picking it up is just plain gross. Don't aggravate other dog owners or neighbors walking outside – pick it up and toss it away in your HOA dumpster. If your dog has an accident on the catwalk, elevator or common walking path, it is your job to clean it up.

Control Their Barking:

There is no bigger pet peeve for your neighbors than a dog that barks uncontrollably. Usually this occurs when someone knocks on the door, or they hear someone in the hallway that startles them. But barking can also happen when you're away, because they're sad, bored, or just miss you. If you have received noise complaints from neighbors, take it seriously and figure out what is causing your dog to bark.

Keep Them on a Short Leash in the Community and in Your Condo Building:

I love my dog, you love your dog; but not everyone in the LOD is a dog lover. Residents may be afraid, allergic or just don't like dogs. Keeping your dog on a leash (preferably a short one) is the courteous thing to do, but it is also the law in Palm Beach County. It's also important when coming into entryways, catwalks, common areas, and elevators that your leash is short (i.e. 3- 4 feet) and that you don't let your dog charge into spaces or jump on residents. No retractable leases only 5 foot maximum. Not every dog wants to meet your dog. When you are in a situation where you cannot avoid other dogs, ensure your leash is kept short. That way no interactions between dogs can happen. If a dog happens to show that he wants space, the best thing to do is keep moving past the dog. Stopping and allowing your dog to fixate will only make the situation worse. If you know other dog owners who have dogs that are friendly and they like to meet: that is great!

Play by the "Common Area" Rules:

LOD has common areas which are shared spaces where both residents and dogs interact. It's not a personal playground, so play by the rules of the condo and be a good neighbor. When walking around the community counterclockwise, your dog should be on your right side along the grass (common area). The grass area and tall hedges on your left (in front of the condo parking lots) are private property. It's dangerous to walk your dog along the tall hedges because aside to being exposed to pesticides, they may end up in a fight with a wild goose, squirrel, or raccoon. NO ESA dogs on the pool deck.

Avoid Wandering:

Always keep an eye on your dog to make sure they don't wander or run onto private property. As you walk them, keep them close to you, especially when you are talking on your cell phone.

Just a Friendly Reminder - The Lakes of Delray is a NO Pet Community: All Service and ESA dogs must be registered with the LOD Property Management Office prior to entry into the premises. Dog owners must provide to the Property Manager the following documents (required by Florida State law): Florida Mental Health Care provider prescription/letter for the ESA dog or certification/letter qualifying the service dog, Palm Beach County dog license along with current rabies vaccination paperwork. Dogs without these qualifying documents may be treated as a pet for purposes of LOD policies.

Present were President Dave Passman, 1st Vice President Ed Simon, 2nd Vice President, Secretary Jessica Krulfeifer, Robin Warner, Treasurer Lonnie Aronson, Director Jayne Weiss, Director Harry Brudka, Director John Callanan, Director Mike Palais (via Zoom), Community Manager Ron Nolan, and Maintenance Manager Anthony Napoli.

Director not present, all in attendance.

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Dave Passman. Dave Passman then led the attendees to the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Dave Passman asked that a quorum exist. Secretary Jessica Krulfeifer said yes quorum existed.

The only issue we had over the summer on the pool deck was the hot pavers. We had some very hot days over the summer, and wearing pool shoes is recommended.

As Dave mentioned, the BBQ area and the grease stains on the brick pavers are not as bad as in the past.

LIBRARY REPORT: Jessica Krulfeifer

The library is doing well, and we are hoping to expand the shelving with the renovation. We received many donated books, and many are very good books.

COMCAST: John Callanan

Five weeks ago, we met with the senior Comcast team. We were promised a construction plan for the completion of the fiber optic cable to the units. We still do not have that plan. The senior VP of South Florida contacted me this morning to say that he will be getting involved now and will have a construction plan shortly. I think we have been hearing this for a year now, so we will keep our fingers crossed.

There is a lot of disruption in this organization. We have had two new community managers since July. We were also asked to supply a list of subscribers who have had a technician come out to resolve the pixelation and freezing screen issues. That list would be those people who are still having issues. The last representative that I heard about told a customer last weekend that there is nothing they can do to remedy those problems until the fiber optics installation is complete. This is the first time I have heard about this, but that is what I heard from their technical personnel.

With our consultant, we have decided to start the process of speaking to other providers to see what our options might be. We are at an early stage of this process, and we are locked into a contract right now. We will see how it goes.

At this meeting, we will be voting on our general contractor. We have hired the architect, and once we hire the general contractor, the creative team is set. The architect will file for permits and start working with the creative team. October 31st will be our first look at any renderings.

November Events:



PROPERTY MANAGER'S REPORT: Ron Nolan

- We are considering the Sims Road trap gate, so we can deal with the piggybacking issues. We have received a quote from one vendor. This will not be the simplest thing to do; one of the issues will be that once we install the trap. This will add another bar between the first bar and the swing gate. If there is any malfunction with the swing gate, you could be stuck between the gates. At Kings Point, they have the flexible delineators on the side of the lane, so you can drive back out if you're stuck. We cannot do that due to the lack of space. We are looking at solutions; the back gate may have to be reconfigured, and the guard house may have to be moved to accommodate the trap gate.
- Anthony took care of the roof leak in the ballroom. We have one minor drip in the small card room, and he will be working on that.
- As Robin mentioned, the shade awning is up at the pickleball area. I had a walk-through with the owner the other day and discussed the damage that was done to the pickleball court.
 We are also looking at root repair at the pickleball court, and we will get those repairs done together.
- Sidewalk repairs have been scheduled, but they have not given me a date. The Ashland A repair and paving is contracted and scheduled.
- The staff have just completed cleaning the awning over the BBQ area. As Dave mentioned, we do see improvements in the BBQ area regarding grease spills.
- Concerning the statutory website for documents, everyone will have the ability to sign on to obtain monthly documents and contracts. Same thing that you are doing for all Associations.

New Business:

Lonnie Aronson makes a motion to approve the 2026 budget and reserve schedule as proposed. Dave Passman seconds, all votes passed.

Lonnie Aronson makes a motion to select First Water General Contractor, subject to their latest proposal and final negotiations. This is to give First Water a letter of intent so that we can move forward with negotiations to get an actual contract.

Harry Bruka Seconds, all votes, 9-0 passed.


