If you are unable to reach the system after multiple tries, you can call the office or the Clubhouse guard. DO NOT go over to the Guardhouse yourself.

GUEST AUTHORIZATION

Please remember that all guests must be called in, or on your guest list to gain entry to the community. Calling the guest authorization system requires that the phone number your are calling from is registered in our database in order to avoid the requirement to enter your phone number and security code when using that system. Anytime you change a phone number, be certain the call the office and update the number on record.

Rules and Regulations

Neighbors,

With the re-opening of the main pool, it has become apparent that many residents have completely forgotten that there are rules and guidelines regarding the patio furniture on the pool deck.

The movement of the patio furniture has become a major problem that is damaging the furniture itself and wasting an extraordinary amount of the staff's time having to move furniture back to its original spot and resetting the entire pool deck daily. Dragging lounge chairs all over the pool deck is noisy and wearing on the leg glides like the tires on your car.

One of the biggest problems is that many residents have no consideration for their fellow neighbors and consistently clutter traffic areas so others, especially those needing wheelchairs, walkers or canes, can't walk through. This is not only inconsiderate, but a fire hazard. Traffic areas must be kept clear at all times. Please make sure there is a wide enough aisle between chairs and tables to maneuver a wheelchair and/or walker.

No one should be dragging a lounge from one side of the pool to the other. If you need to rotate a lounge to face the sun or your friends, go ahead, but dragging them all over the deck, and completely rearranging the deck as if it's your personal patio, is unacceptable. Lounge chairs are bulky and hard to move, so ask a buddy to help.

REMEMBER...The LOD Pool Cabana Boy no longer works here.

- Each table has four chairs assigned to it. For those neighbors playing games, chairs are for your butt, not handbags or totes... especially on a busy pool day.
- No furniture can be placed within four feet of the pool edge. Close the umbrella after each use.
- When 'borrowing' an empty chair from an occupied table, if possible, ask if you can use that chair. Just because nothing is on the chair at an occupied table does not mean it is not being used.

It's understandable that furniture movement happens when you sit together or play with a group of friends or neighbors, but please remember to move the item back to its original location...

Dog Decorum: Tips for Dog Owners

Always Pick Up After Your Dog:

Picking up waste from your dog is by far the #1 dog etiquette rule, because dogs' waste can spread disease, is harmful to the environment, and not picking it up is just plain gross. Don't aggravate other dog owners or neighbors walking outside — pick it up and toss it away in your HOA dumpster. If your dog has an accident in the catwalk, elevator or common walking path, it is your job to clean it up.

Control Their Barking:

There is no bigger pet peeve for your neighbors than a dog that barks uncontrollably. Usually this occurs when someone knocks on the door, or they hear someone in the hallway that startles them. But barking can also happen when you're away, because they're sad, bored, or just miss you. If you have received noise complaints from neighbors, take it seriously and figure out what is causing your dog to bark.

Keep Them on a Short Leash in the Community and in Your Condo Building:

I love my dog, you love your dog; but not everyone in the LOD is a dog lover. Residents may be afraid, allergic or just don't like dogs. Keeping your dog on a leash (preferably a short one) is the courteous thing to do, but it is also the law in Palm Beach County. It's also important when coming into entryways, catwalks, common areas, and elevators that your leash is short (i.e. 3- 4 feet) and that you don't let your dog charge into spaces or jump on residents. No retractable leases only 5 foot maximum. Not every dog wants to meet your dog. When you are in a situation where you cannot avoid other dogs, ensure your leash is kept short. That way no interactions between dogs can happen. If a dog happens to show that he wants space, the best thing to do is keep moving past the dog. Stopping and allowing your dog to fixate will only make the situation worse. If you know other dog owners who have dogs that are friendly and they like to meet: that is great!

Play by the "Common Area" Rules:


LOD has common areas which are shared spaces where both residents and dogs interact. It's not a personal playground, so play by the rules of the condo and be a good neighbor. When walking around the community counterclockwise, your dog should be on your right side along the grass (common area). The grass area and tall hedges on your left (in front of the condo parking lots) are private property. It's dangerous to walk your dog along the tall hedges because aside to being exposed to pesticides, they may end up in a fight with a wild goose, squirrel, or raccoon. NO ESA dogs on the pool deck.

LOD Board Meeting Minutes

LAKES OF DELRAY, INC. BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S MEETING

Wednesday, March 13th, 2024 MINUTES

The Lakes of Delray, Inc. held its Board of Directors' Meeting at 15055 Lakes of Delray Boulevard, Delray Beach, Florida 33484, on Wednesday, March 13, 202. Present were President Bob Berger, 1st Vice President Ed Simon, 2nd Vice President Dave Passman, Treasurer Lonnie Aronson, Secretary Jayne Weiss, Director Susan Heiferman, Director Jessica Krulfeifer, Director Robin Warner, Director Harry Brudka, and Community Manager Ron Nolan

All Present:

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Bob Berger, who then led the attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance. Secretary Jayne Weiss declared that a quorum exists.

Verification of the Associations not present: Ashland G, Pembridge G, Pembridge H, Witney A, Witney B, and Witney Manor C.

President Bob Berger moved to approve the minutes of the February 14, 2024, meeting, Ed Simon seconds.

CORRESPONDENCE: Jayne Weiss

No Report

PRESIDENT Bob Berger

1. I'll start off with a construction update. The work on the deck is completed. The electrician is working on the lights for the stairs and the lights and the fans for under the deck have been ordered. Once again, the lights will not be operational until the spa is completed because the wiring needs to run through the spa construction zone. And speaking of the spa, the pump room has become a problem. We have had to hire a company whose job will be to secure the existing tanks in the pump room as well as the building. Ron will have more on that in his report. No shortcuts can be taken to ensure the integrity of the building. The company that will do this work is booked up and unfortunately, this will probably push the completion of the spa back to sometime in May. We have picked out the tiles that will go into the spa and I have asked Ron to order extra tiles that match the spa tiles so we can use them in the main pool. The main pool is not scheduled to be resurfaced for a few years, but it makes sense to buy the tiles now to make sure that we have them when we are ready to use them. We cannot install these new tiles in the pool now because draining the pool will dry out the existing marcite in the pool and we would have to redo the entire pool. The last time that was done was about 6 or 7 years ago. The pool was closed for a month and nobody wants to see the pool close again at this time. The main pool will need to be

- resurfaced in a few years and when that happens, we will be able to have the tiles to match the spa.
- 2. It appears that we are under budget. We have left from the assessment money approximately \$353,000 and we still need to pay at least another \$289,000 that we know of and probably at least another \$30,000 for pavers in the spa area. It appears that we will not have to pay any additional money to Zarco Construction. We have the draft of the letter to fire Zarco but we were waiting for the change of contractor on the master permit to the company that is taking Zarco's place and that took place yesterday. We have told Zarco that they are done and so far they have not asked for any additional money. If they do ask for money I have been having pain in my neck because every muscle in my neck is irritated. I am in rehab for my neck and I am in a lot of pain when I type and even more pain when I have to sign a check. If Zarco asks for more money I do not think I will be able to stand the pain of signing a check for them so they are not getting any more money. The new decking company came in at, I believe, \$6,000 less than Zarco but once they started work, they found that they had to redo some of the patching that Zarco did and that will probably bring the cost back up to the original cost.
- 3. We were planning to have a grand reopening party with a full Café LOD with some new additions and we have been in touch with Becky Weinberg's band to play on the pool deck that night. They enthusiastically said yes and they told us that this is their favorite place to play due to the enthusiasm of our residents, but with the additional time it will take to finish the spa and put the barbecue area back together we probably will lose Becky because Bruce Springsteen is starting the European leg of his tour in early May and Becky is leaving for a home she and Max own in Italy. I believe in the third week of April she flies around from country to country under the guise of following the band, but she has told me that she likes to shop in the various countries where the band is performing. If we lose Becky, we will get her back here in the fall and we will get another band for the grand reopening party.
- 4. I mentioned at last month's meeting that we would mark off the air hose and vacuum parking as a no-parking zone. Anthony got stencils and paint and he completed that task. We ask that you park vertically into the parking spots while using the air hose and vacuum. I am still seeing residents parking horizontally over the two parking spaces and that stops a second car from pulling in. Please be courteous and pull your car into the parking spaces vertically. Also, when you are done adding air to your tires or using the vacuum, please put it back in its place and make sure you do not drive away with the hoses.
- 5. Our charity events for St. Jude's Children's Hospital were highly successful this year. We started off with our annual walk-a-thon which was well attended. After the walk-a-thon, we had the tennis and pickleball classic, the mahjong and canasta game day, the comedy roast with the fashion show, and of course, the LOD bistro. A lot of hard work
