If you are unable to reach the system after multiple tries, you can call the office or the Clubhouse guard. DO NOT go over to the Guardhouse yourself.

Calling the guest authorization system requires that the phone number your are calling from is registered in our database in order to avoid the requirement to enter your phone number and security code when using that system. 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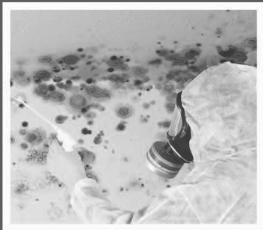

At the recent reorganization meeting on Wednesday, May 13th, the Board decided to continue this month with a Board report. Since last month's report, the Board has moved forward in many ways.

Renovation: The applications for permits have been filed, and the architectural drawings are complete. We have started value engineering the designs and construction specs. We are vetting the contractor candidates and their bids are due the 22nd of May.

A decision will be made shortly after. The next step in this process is to choose a source for our fixtures and furniture. All information including financials will be current on the portal website- <https://lakesofdelray.mycommunitysite.co/login>

The website is the best source of information with monthly updates as this project develops.

Comcast: We have received Comcast's response to our default notice and are now evaluating our options for cable services going forward. We are in year 6 of our 10 year contract with Comcast.

Landscaping: New flowers will be purchased for the main pool.

Swipe Doors: The Board will be voting yes on May 13th to install swipe doors for easy access to the upstairs bathrooms and the bathrooms poolside under the building. They will be installed as soon as possible.

Summer Entertainment: Carol has been working closely with Amanda to plan many activities to fill the summer days and nights. Pool parties, music, Bistro and more.

Don't forget, July 3rd is free Hotdog Day. Free dogs, chips and soda to celebrate the holiday.

We are looking for volunteers to help with the many activities planned and for the library.

Please let the office know that you would love to volunteer and they will pass your name along.

Walkers, Joggers, and Bike Riders Etiquette

With daylight savings time here, more walkers, joggers and bike riders are taking advantage of the extended daylight hours. Walking, jogging and bike riding are great activities and exercises to do right now. It is important for everyone to be aware of some simple guidelines for sharing LOD walkways.

FRIENDLY REMINDERS FOR BIKE RIDERS

- Respect the rules of the road. If riding in the street, ride with traffic, not against it. Not only is bike riding against traffic illegal in most states, but it is also dangerous. Use hand signals to warn others road users that you will be making a turn or will be stopping.
- Be aware of drivers making turns in and out of parking lots.
- Give walkers and joggers space. Announce your presence by ringing a bike bell or horn, or just announce that you are coming up behind them, planning to turn or stopping.
- Wear a helmet and other safety equipment. Wear light colored or reflective clothing as it gets dark.
- Remain unplugged from phones, music or other noise distractions so you can hear background noise or potential hazards.
- Ride predictably, not haphazardly.
- When passing a walker/jogger look ahead and behind to ensure it is safe to pass.
- If riding at night, use lights, a red light for the back, and a white one for the front.
- Don't be an apathetic rider...SAY HELLO.

FRIENDLY REMINDERS FOR WALKERS/ JOGGERS

- A lot of the bike riding guidelines hold true for walkers and joggers.
- Give everyone space.
- Be aware of your surroundings. Look ahead for bike riders, joggers and fast walkers. When possible, move over to give them room to pass.
- When crossing a road and a car driver about to turn is allowing you the right of way, thank him/her by making eye contact or giving a polite smile or hand wave. Try not to stop suddenly.
- Do not take up the entire walkway. When walking in a group, try not to walk in a parallel line.
- Stick to one side of the walkway. When possible, avoid walking in the middle or changing sides on the walkway. This allows those who are moving faster than you to pass. If you are planning on passing another walker, announce yourself by saying out loud "on your left". Let other people pass you as well.
- Remain unplugged from phones, music or other distractions so you can hear background noise and potential hazards. It is okay to answer an occasional text or phone call or change a song, but do not go updating your Facebook status or uploading a picture on Instagram while walking. Not only is it dangerous, but it is inconsiderate when you walking slower than the people behind you.
- Don't multitask.

Clubhouse Renovation

Architect and Engineering Drawings were submitted to Palm Beach County for permits on 4/29. Timing before we get permits is estimated to be 12 weeks or mid-July. We are utilizing the services of a permit expeditor to speed up this process.

In the meantime, Brown Group is conducting value engineering to get the furniture and fixtures within budget. Revised packages' due date is May 12. We will be vetting four different purchasing sources.

CELA 4 is vetting three contractors, and their quotes are due to us on May 22.

We will then develop a clear budget breakdown separating hard construction, furniture and fixtures, and soft costs.

Send a "3" to request a call back. Anytime you are concerned about an outage, you can text "out" to this number and it will automatically let you know if there is a reported outage in your area. This is assuming that your cell number is registered with Comcast.

1. Update your passwords-including your home Wi-Fi. Don't use your grandkids or pets names. Instead, try a passphrase you'll remember, but substitute a symbol for a letter.
2. Change your settings-on your phone to send all unknown numbers to voicemail.
On iPhones go the Settings, Apps, Phone, then silence.
Android phones vary, so google instructions
3. Do a privacy checkup- on social media. Under settings, choose privacy, and check to make sure only people you choose see your media posts.
4. Freeze your credit-This prevents crooks from stealing your identity and opening new credit cards in your name. Unfreeze it when necessary to allow a credit search.
5. Take your Social Security Card out of your wallet.

Song: Hurricane, Hurricane

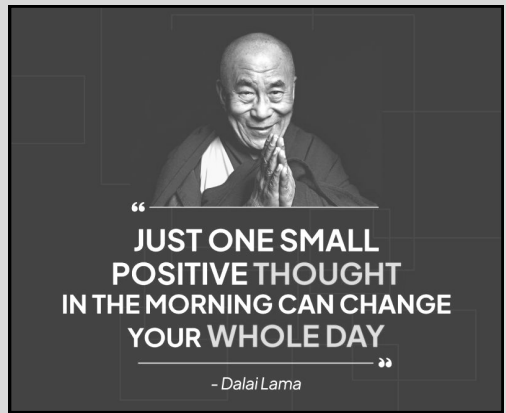

 That hurricane's coming, turning everything blue

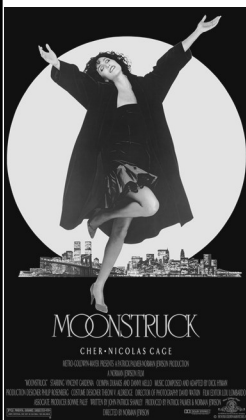

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by President Robin Warner.

Ron Nolan will give proof of notice. Community Manager Ron Nolan stated that he posted the meeting notice on May 11, 2026, and by email on May 11, 2026. President Robin Warner asked Director Harry Brudka if we had a quorum. Director Harry Brudka gave the list of Associations that are not present: Ashland F, Ashland G, Pembridge B, Witney Manor C, and Witney Manor D.

I want to say that being the interim President has been a learning experience, and I really enjoyed it.

TREASURER REPORT/ CAPITAL CONTRIBUTIONS:

Lonnie Aronson

Year-to-date, as of April 30, 2026, income of \$1,088,000, expenses of \$984,346, and net income of \$104,300. Capital contributions with \$8,100 allocated for pool chair slings, leaving a total of \$214,920 unallocated. Renovation funds: \$2,816,000; all buildings have paid their assessments. Interest \$1,454.00, total renovation budget \$2,817,454.

Renovation expenses, decorator, \$98,000, owners represented \$54,000, the architect \$29,000. We have not paid for a contractor, as we are still looking to hire one. Miscellaneous at \$25,000, including attorney notes, pool table, and installation and pool chair supplies.

The community is in year 6 of a 10-year agreement; the board is considering waiting out the contract and negotiating with new providers such as FiberNow, Hotwire, Breathe, or Bluestream.

The board is working with its attorney and Comcast to explore the cost of exiting the contract and whether a new provider would offset any penalty. No resolution is reached; negotiations and legal consultation are ongoing.

CLUBHOUSE ACCESS PROJECT: John Callanan

On April 8th, the owner's rep, Cele4, and our team met to assess which design items could be omitted, re-specified, or maintained as originally designed.

A follow-up meeting was held with Brown Interiors on April 17th to further review the design details, finish selections, and project specifications. The purpose of the meeting was to confirm acceptable value engineering revisions and assess potential adjustments necessary to bring the project back in line with the established budget.

During April, our owners' rep searched and evaluated several expediting firms for permitting. First Quarter Custom Builders provides permitting services as part of their pre-construction

scope at no additional charge.

Two permit applications (demolition and master permit) were submitted to Palm Beach County on April 29th.

Four general contract firms are candidates for the renovation: First Quarter Custom Builders, Oatley Construction, Anderson Car Construction, and Zavala Construction. Sealed bids are due May 22nd. Contractor bid activity (subcontractor visits) will be visible in the building over the next two weeks.

PROPERTY MANAGER'S REPORT: Ron Nolan

- Announced that the 2025 annual financial statement is complete and will be posted on the website within a few days; physical copies are available at the office.
- A new maintenance supervisor starts Tuesday or Wednesday of the following week.
- A new bookkeeper starts the following Friday.

New Business:

- Jayne Weiss, I make a motion to hire Assa Abloy to install four automatic door openers at a cost of \$21,935 and Razorback Electric for electrical work at \$1,140, both funded from Capital Contributions. **Motion passed unanimously.**
- Harry Brudka, I make a motion to approve a comprehensive update to community rules and regulations, revision two. **Motion passed unanimously.**
- Lonnie Aronson, I make a motion to hire Lancelot Industries to resurface the main pickleball and tennis courts, satellite tennis courts, and shuffleboard courts at a combined cost of \$55,000, funded from reserves. **Motion passed unanimously.**
- Lonnie Aronson, I make a motion to hire All County Paving for specific repairs, seal coat, and striping of the Clubhouse parking lot at a cost of \$32,988, funded from reserves. **Motion passed unanimously.**
- Lonnie Aronson, I make a motion to hire All County Paving to restripe main LOD roadways at a cost of \$19,226, funded from reserves. **Motion passed unanimously.**
- Lonnie Aronson, I make a motion that All County Paving to mill and pave the remainder of the entrance road, including specific sections at the intersection and associated striping, for \$80,335, funded from reserves. **Motion passed unanimously.**
- John Callanan, I make a motion to fine and suspend the occupant of Ashland B, Unit 60, for three violations, a fine of \$100 per violation listed in a notice dated April 24th, 2026. Additionally, the occupant will be suspended from recreational facilities for 30 days; a hearing will be scheduled with the Fining Committee, and notice will be provided to the occupant. **Motion passed unanimously.**
- The board conducted its annual reorganization vote to elect officers. President John Callanan, Robin Warner, 1st Vice President, Harry Brudka, 2nd Vice President and Parliamentarian, Jessica Krulfifer, Secretary, Lonnie Aronson, Treasurer; remaining members serve as Directors.

GOOD AND WELFARE:

- Paul WAT A promoted the Sing and Scene Club's upcoming free performance, "Skits & Giggles," on June 17th at 7pm.
- Bob ASH C raised concern that Julian Soffer (Realtor), who was unanimously banned from advertising in the LOD Times in April 2021 due to multiple violations, has reappeared in the publication without a public vote.
- The Board clarified that the vote to reinstate was made at an agenda meeting, which is a legitimate board meeting, following multiple written pleadings from Julian Soffer. The board acknowledged the concern and stated it would be taken into consideration.
- Roy ASH, I commended the board for posting renovation expenditures on the portal, but requested a detailed spreadsheet showing how the remaining approximately \$2.6 million will be allocated across all components (construction, furniture, lighting, flooring, etc.).
- The Board explained that contractor bids are still pending (due May 22nd) and that once received, a detailed allocation notice will be posted on the website showing line items, amounts spent, and expected remaining expenditures.
- Jeff Wat described dangerous speeding and stop sign violations observed on May 7th, nearly resulting in a collision with his bicycle. Suggested painting the word "STOP" on the pavement in front of stop signs.
- Ron Nolan acknowledged the long-standing issue and noted that past measures (painted stops, reflectors) have been →

ineffective. The board is exploring traffic cameras that can identify violators, issue fines, and disable transponders, as used effectively in other communities.

- Marvin WAT E repeated his ongoing request for a cooler surface (white tile or similar) between the pool and the shoe rack area, as the current tiles burn feet.
- Ron Nolan confirmed that mats are on order and samples are in shipment; long-term paver replacement is also being evaluated.
- Marsha ASH H informed residents that vote-by-mail applications must be resubmitted for the 2026 election; forms and contact information are available.
- The Board confirmed that the Clubhouse cannot guarantee space as a polling location during renovation; the Supervisor of Elections is identifying an alternative location and will notify all residents by mail.
- Kenny PEM F expressed displeasure at the lack of transparency, stating the vote to reinstate advertising appeared to be made at a non-public agenda meeting without community awareness.
- Ron Nolan clarified that the vote to reinstate was made at an agenda meeting, which is a legitimate board meeting, following multiple written pleadings from Julian Soffer. The board acknowledged the concern and stated it would be taken into consideration.
- Ginny ASH B raised concern about the quality of chairs being selected for the renovation, citing 38 years of professional experience and questioning whether the committee has sufficient expertise to select durable chairs for 1,400 residents. Requested confirmation that Brown Interiors designers hold ASID certification.
- The Board clarified that Brown Interiors is the professional designer guiding selections, that bulk ordering of over 800 chairs is planned, and that additional vendors are being vetted to optimize pricing without sacrificing quality, and the Board will confirm ASID certification of Brown Interiors designers; the designer is leading the chair selection process.
- Paul WAT A, Advocated for speed bumps.
- Ron Nolan noted that speed bumps have been installed and removed in other communities due to resident complaints and concerns about emergency vehicles and buses.
- Roslyn WAT D expressed concern about the increasing number of dogs in the community, including visitors bringing pets, and suggested a formal application process similar to Kings Point.
- The Board noted that building presidents are responsible for verifying emotional support animal documentation and that over 200 dogs are currently registered with management.
- Susanne ASH, I agreed that visitors and non-residents should not be permitted to bring dogs without proper documentation and called for stricter enforcement at the building level.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:57 AM, Kate Cunnion respectfully submits.

Dog Decorum: Tips for Dog Owners

Always Pick Up After Your Dog:

Picking up waste from your dog is by far the #1 dog etiquette rule, because dogs' waste can spread disease, is harmful to the environment, and not picking it up is just plain gross. Don't aggravate other dog owners or neighbors walking outside – pick it up and toss it away in your HOA dumpster. If your dog has an accident on the catwalk, elevator or common walking path, it is your job to clean it up.

Control Their Barking:

There is no bigger pet peeve for your neighbors than a dog that barks uncontrollably. Usually this occurs when someone knocks on the door, or they hear someone in the hallway that startles them. But barking can also happen when you're away, because they're sad, bored, or just miss you. If you have received noise complaints from neighbors, take it seriously and figure out what is causing your dog to bark.

Keep Them on a Short Leash in the Community and in Your Condo Building:

I love my dog, you love your dog; but not everyone in the LOD is a dog lover. Residents may be afraid, allergic or just don't like dogs. Keeping your dog on a leash (preferably a short one) is the courteous thing to do, but it is also the law in Palm Beach County. It's also important when coming into entryways, catwalks, common areas, and elevators that your leash is short (i.e. 3- 4 feet) and that you don't let your dog charge into spaces or jump on residents. **No retractable leashes only 5 foot maximum.** Not every dog wants to meet your dog. When you are in a situation where you cannot avoid other dogs, ensure your leash is kept short. That way no interactions between dogs can happen. If a dog happens to show that he wants space, the best thing to do is keep moving past the dog. Stopping and allowing your dog to fixate will only make the situation worse. If you know other dog owners who have dogs that are friendly and they like to meet: that is great!

Play by the "Common Area" Rules:

LOD has common areas which are shared spaces where both residents and dogs interact. It's not a personal playground, so play by the rules of the condo and be a good neighbor. When walking around the community counterclockwise, your dog should be on your right side along the grass (common area). The grass area and tall hedges on your left (in front of the condo parking lots) are private property. It's dangerous to walk your dog along the tall hedges because aside to being exposed to pesticides, they may end up in a fight with a wild goose, squirrel, or raccoon. **NO ESA dogs on the pool deck.**

Avoid Wandering:

Always keep an eye on your dog to make sure they don't wander or run onto private property. As you walk them, keep them close to you, especially when you are talking on your cell phone.

Just a Friendly Reminder - The Lakes of Delray is a NO Pet Community: All Service and ESA dogs must be registered with the LOD Property Management Office prior to entry into the premises. Dog owners must provide to the Property Manager the following documents (required by Florida State law): Florida Mental Health Care provider prescription/letter for the ESA dog or certification/letter qualifying the service dog, Palm Beach County dog license along with current rabies vaccination paperwork. Dogs without these qualifying documents may be treated as a pet for purposes of LOD policies.

Goal: Practice 5-10 minutes of daily mindfulness or deep breathing!

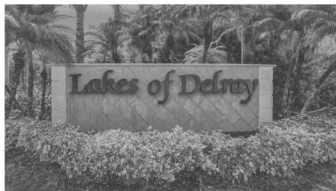


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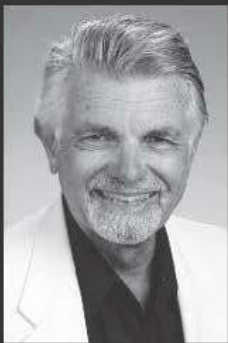


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
