



We then moved on to the Farmers Market in our parking lot. It was well received and another is scheduled for


We had a super show with Elton Dan and the Rocket Band. You couldn't help but get up and dance; they were terrific.

Security- Lost and Found

Among the many services provided by the LAKES OF DELRAY office, the handling of LOST & FOUND items is one that is overlooked and understated. But its usefulness to those who need to avail themselves of it can often be of very high value. We hope that the following guidelines help both those that find themselves missing items and those that have items.

If you come across an item that seems to be lost or abandoned, the first and wisest course of action would be to determine if the item's owner is still in the vicinity. Simply asking the closest people around is often a quick resolution since residents often walk away from an area they were occupying and return shortly. When that is not possible, the next best option would be to bring the item to the office during business hours, MON-FRI 9AM-4PM.

When the office is not open, the clubhouse guard in the lobby would be happy to assist you. Residents often go directly to the guard to inquire about lost or missing items. A call to the office to leave a voice message is also a simple way to inform persons missing something that the item has been located and is safe until its return can be arranged.

Those that are missing an item are always welcome to call or stop by the office to inquire about the return of the item. If it is not among the items that have been collected, Kate has a list that your name can be added to, and of course, you can call back in a few days to check.

Like many things, we hope you will never find yourself in need of these services, but as we all know, life happens. And when it does, it's nice to know that there is a thoughtful LOD neighbor to lend a hand.





Dog Decorum: Etiquette Tips for Dog Owners

Always Pick Up After Your Dog:

Picking up waste from your dog is by far the #1 dog etiquette rule, because dogs' waste can spread disease, is harmful to the environment, and not picking it up is just plain gross. Don't aggravate other dog owners or neighbors walking outside – pick it up and toss it away in your HOA dumpster. If your dog has an accident in the catwalk, elevator or common walking path, it is your job to clean it up.

Control Their Barking:

There is no bigger pet peeve for your neighbors than a dog that barks uncontrollably. Usually this occurs when someone knocks on the door, or they hear someone in the hallway that startles them. But barking can also happen when you're away, because they're sad, bored, or just miss you. If you have received noise complaints from neighbors, take it seriously and figure out what is causing your dog to bark.

Keep Them on a Short Leash in the Community and in Your Condo Building:

I love my dog, you love your dog; but not everyone in the LOD is a dog lover. Residents may be afraid, allergic or just don't like dogs. Keeping your dog on a leash (preferably a short one) is the courteous thing to do, but it is also the law in Palm Beach County. It's also important when coming into entryways, catwalks, common areas, and elevators that your leash is short (i.e. 3- 4 feet) and that you don't let your dog charge into spaces or jump on residents. Not every dog wants to meet your dog. When you are in a situation where you cannot avoid other dogs, ensure your leash is kept short. That way no interactions between dogs can happen. If a dog happens to show that he wants space, the best thing to do is keep moving past the dog. Stopping and allowing your dog to fixate will only make the situation worse. If you know other dog owners who have dogs that are friendly and they like to meet: that is great!

Play by the "Common Area" Rules:

LOD has common areas which are shared spaces where both residents and dogs interact. It's not a personal play-ground, so play by the rules of the condo and be a good neighbor. When walking around the community counter-clockwise, your dog should be on your right side along the grass (common area). The grass area and tall hedges on your left (in front of the condo parking lots) are private property. It's dangerous to walk your dog along the tall hedges because aside to being exposed to pesticides, they may end up in a fight with a wild goose, squirrel, or raccoon.

Avoid Wandering:

Always keep an eye on your dog to make sure they don't wander or run onto private property. As you walk them, keep them close to you, especially when you are talking on your cell phone.

Friendly Reminder - The Lakes of Delray is a NO Pet Community:

All Service and ESA dogs must be registered with the LOD Property Management Office prior to entry into the premises. Dog owners must provide to the Property Manager the following documents (required by Florida State law): Florida Mental Health Care provider prescription/letter for the ESA dog or certification/letter qualifying the service dog, Palm Beach County dog license along with current rabies vaccination paperwork. Dogs without these qualifying documents may be treated as a pet for purposes of LOD policies.

When walking your support animal please carry the pets ID with you. Thank you.

LOD Board Meeting Minutes

LAKES OF DELRAY, INC. BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S MEETING

Wednesday, February 8, 2023

MINUTES

The Lakes of Delray, Inc. held its Board of Director's Meeting at 15055 Lakes of Delray Boulevard, Delray Beach, Florida 33484, on Wednesday, February 8, 2023. Present were: President Bob Berger, Secretary Jayne Kulyassa, Director Susan Heiferman, Director Jessica Krulfeifer, Director Harry Brudka, Director Robin Warner, and Community Manager Ron Nolan

Not Present: 2nd Vice President Dave Passman and 1st Vice President Ed Simon.

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 am by Bob Berger, who then led the attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance. Secretary Jayne Kulyassa declared that a quorum exists.

Verification of the Associations not present: Ashland G, Watersedge B, Watersedge H, and Witney Manor C.

President Bob Berger moved to approve the minutes of the December 7th, 2022 meeting; Lonnie Aronson seconds.

CORRESPONDENCE: Jayne Kulyassa

No Report

PRESIDENT: Bob Berger

Since our last meeting, we lost two rock and roll legends, Jeff Beck and David Crosby. Today's opening song was a tribute to David Crosby. David Crosby was very influential in my life. The opening song I played today was "Long Time Gone" which Crosby wrote about the Robert Kennedy assassination. Other songs David Crosby wrote include:

- Almost Cut My Hair
- Eight Miles High
- Guinnevere
- Triad
- Wooden Ships with Stephen Stills and Paul Kantner
- Déjà vu
- The Lee Shore

You guys know me as a big Bruce Springsteen fan, and I was at the Springsteen concert last night at the Hard Rock ...here is a short clip of Dancing In The Dark, but long before I got into Springsteen I was very much into Crosby, Stills, Nash, and Young.

Many of us consider Crosby, Stills, Nash, and Young the voices of our generation. Their CSN&Y album "4 Way Street" was the most played album in my four years of living in my fraternity house at Bradley University. On the night

Richard Nixon resigned I was at a Crosby, Stills, Nash, and Young concert at a rickety old stadium in Jersey City, NJ called Roosevelt Stadium, which has long since been torn down. When Nixon resigned, Graham Nash tried to explain it very detailed and slowly, but David Crosby yelled out "Nixon resigned, Nixon resigned" and he said, "On the night Richard Nixon resigned we must carry on and they broke into a great version of "Carry On" complete with fireworks.

During the Chicago 7 trial, Graham Nash wrote the song "Chicago", which became another anthem for the anti-war movement and David Crosby made sure they got that song on the radio as soon as possible.

When the Kent State shooting took place on May 4th, 1970, Neil Young walked into the woods near his home and an hour later he walked out after writing the song "Ohio" in one hour. David Crosby heard that song, he immediately called Stephen Stills and told him to arrange for a studio and the band recorded that song that afternoon. It was on the radio the next day. That song changed my life. That song got me to be politically active. I saw fellow students murdered by our army for peacefully protesting the Viet Nam War and I got my rear end out of my fraternity house, and I joined anti-war marches on campus and I have remained politically active ever since.

When the Berlin wall was torn down, Crosby, Stills, and Nash were standing on top of the wall singing. David Crosby arranged for them to be there. He meant a lot to me and he will be sorely missed.

- The construction schedule for the infrastructure jobs has been pushed back because there is a backup of obtaining permits from Palm Beach County, which was expected. This will delay the start of construction by one month.
- The electrician for the construction jobs who we had never met quit two weeks ago and Hillman Engineering immediately brought in a new electrician for the construction jobs. Ron and I like this new electrician very much. He is currently working on a construction job at Boca West which is a good sign to me. He came to meet us without knowing the job and he immediately understood what we are trying to accomplish. He will trench the pool deck instead of ripping it up. That is something that Ron has been hoping for and he will detail that more in his report. Trenching the pool deck instead of digging it up should hopefully mean less time that the pool deck will need to be closed. But we still will not know how long the pool deck will be closed until the work is underway. Some work can be done without permits and tomorrow morning, starting at 8:00 AM, Zarco Construction will perform what is known as a "mockup," which is where they will be working on a 4' X 4' section of the deck, performing the work they will be doing on the entire deck. The work will be done on the far North side of the deck alongside the building. Ron will detail that further in his report.
- Zarco Construction will probably be bringing in a work trailer which will go on the northern side of the pool parking lot. They will have use of the three parking spaces next to the handball courts for the duration of the

projects. They will be bringing in portable toilets so their staff will not be using our restrooms. LOD residents cannot use the portable toilets.

- Satellite#1 pool has a major leak which is located deep under the pool about four feet from the edge of the pool. I have a photo of Anthony standing in a hole he dug in the deck of Satellite #1 pool. The break is much deeper under the pool than this photo shows, and it is four feet further in under the pool from where Anthony is standing and it is not safe for Anthony to go in and under any further. Our regular leak detection company could not repair this, and we will need to hire an engineer to perform the repairs. The cost of repairs is going to be between \$3,500-\$5,000. Ron will have more on this in his report.
- Fran Talaber and Sue Heiferman, who have been running Café LOD, are stepping down. They have done a fantastic job reorganizing the Café and I sincerely thank them for doing a great job. The purchasing of food has become a major problem due to supply chain problems. When Milt Weller started Café LOD he was able to get most of the food at the restaurant depot, but now the restaurant depot does not carry enough hotdogs and hamburgers and rolls to meet our needs. Therefore, those who are running Café LOD are running all over the place to try and get enough food so we do not run out of food at any event. They are going to the restaurant depot, Costco and BJ's, and elsewhere to purchase enough food. We are looking for a company who will deliver to us. The LOD staff will do a Café LOD "going out of business sale" with some volunteers to get rid of the food we have frozen one afternoon soon, and they will try to sell everything we have either at half price or for \$1 and Café LOD will go on hiatus until the construction is completed. When Café LOD starts up again, Jayne and Robin will be running it and they have some new ideas which I think you will like.
- Lonnie stepped down from Bingo. Sue and new volunteers will be running it going forward, but Lonnie and Rita will do the Bingo luncheon. Many new volunteers for bingo but more are needed. Lonnie will have more on the Bingo luncheon during her report. Sue needs volunteers for regular bingo and she will have more on that in her report.
- LOD Bistro on Monday and Friday mornings has become very popular. Once again, more volunteers are needed, and Robin will have more on that in her report.
- The new resident orientation is this afternoon from 1:30-3:30 PM in the small card room. Dave will not be there to run it and I want to thank Jaci Gottheim who has stepped up to run this event with the other committee members. If you are a new resident and have not received an invitation, you are welcome to come this afternoon. The purpose of this orientation is to teach new residents about how the Lakes of Delray operates and what LOD has to offer. They will learn the Lakes of Delray rules, be informed of the many activities we have to offer and, of course answer any questions they may have.
- Ron is waiting for the architect to come here and do the drawings for the base of what will be the shaded area by the Pickleball courts.
- Here is an update on the request to move the smoking area near the handball courts. Our attorney told us two days ago

- that we could vote to ban smoking in the common areas. I have not yet discussed this with the Board and it will be a topic at our March agenda workshop on March 2nd. In the meantime, the person who smokes the most during the day has come to me and she has volunteered to smoke in her car when there is a Pickleball match going on. That should alleviate most of the problems the Pickleball players have encountered with secondhand smoke. With the added costs of repairing Satellite Pool #1 and the costs of the infrastructure jobs, it is not a good time to spend thousands of dollars to pave an area in the parking lot for a new smoking area. Our attorney has advised us not to move the smoking area into the parking lot. Additionally, we are going to incur the expense of buying new used golf carts. Two of our present golf carts that are used by the maintenance staff are on their last legs and need to be replaced. The cost of used golf carts has skyrocketed just like used cars.
- Comcast's problems have lessened somewhat. I have been receiving less complaints than we had in December. I did have one couple who were mailed antiquated equipment that was not compatible with the new Comcast wiring and we got that worked out for them. With Comcast, a lot depends on who you get on the phone. My advice is: if you see you are getting nowhere with whomever you are talking to on the phone at Comcast, just hang up on them and call back and hopefully you will get a more knowledgeable person. I did go back and forth with one resident who it turned out, had her problem resolved two days before writing to me. When I asked her why she is still complaining that her service is not working when it has been fixed, she told me that she knows it will happen again and that I should DO MY JOB! Well, fast forward one week and I was alerted that someone who was playing cards in the library at night walked over to the barbecue area, picked up the Keurig coffee machine, and took it to the library because her friends were too lazy to walk over to the barbecue area to make coffee. Well, I did some investigating with the help of those who were at the barbecue area that night and with Ron watching the video from the security camera. I caught the person and it turned out the be the same woman who told me to do my job. Well, I guess I did my job on that one. Nobody is permitted to move any appliances from where they are located.
- I found out yesterday that there is now a possibility that the County will be opening up Sims Road to through traffic from Atlantic Avenue to Linton Blvd. The Delray Alliance had maintained that there was no money for this project but it appears as if this has changed. I assume the County feels a need for this road as a shortcut for ambulances to get to Delray Medical Center. Based on that need there is no way that we could protest this. We would look foolish if we tried to stop this. I have sent an email to Dr. Vinikoor at the Delray Alliance for confirmation that this project is happening.
- Yesterday only 61 residents got for Covid. Last week 96 residents got tested and we had seven positive cases. The total number of residents and staff who have been tested now stands at 4,846.
- I get a lot of weird questions. None more so than the one I got last week. We had an alligator in the lake last Tuesday and a resident came over to me and asked why we permit alligators here! Really?
